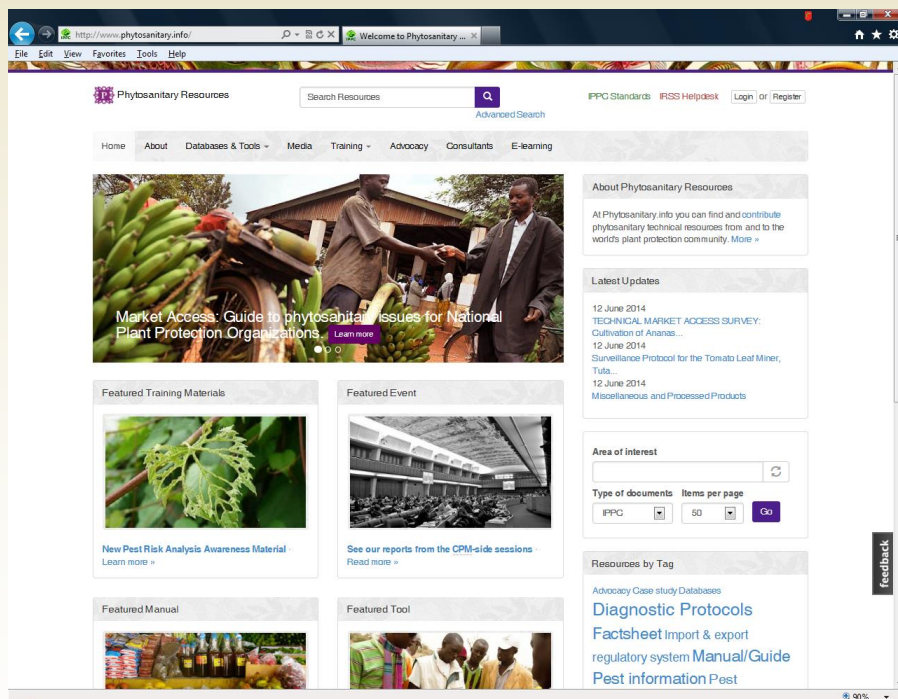


Recent updates

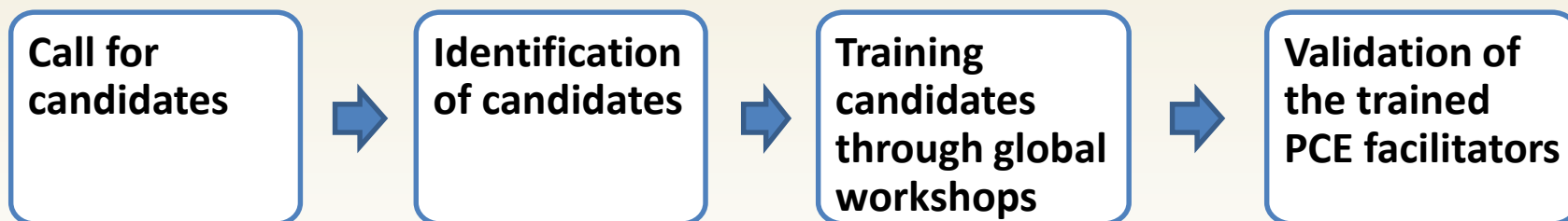
