STANDARD SETTING WORK PLAN FOR 2016 AND 2017

(Prepared by the Secretariat)

Background

- [1] Following recommendations from the Enhancement Evaluation study and the Commission on Phytosanitary Measures (CPM) Bureau, the Secretariat has developed an integrated work plan for 2016 (and tentatively for 2017). This paper presents the standard setting part which is based on the clear priorities set by CPM.
- The standard setting work plan is developed based on the two main tools that show the status of [2] standards and the planned work within standard setting, and that should be consulted for explanatory details:
 - (1)The List of Topics for IPPC standards (LOT) which is updated after each Standards Committee (SC) meeting and which presents the status of each item as well as the CPM priority (considering also the additional guidance from CPM to treat topics for which a draft ISPM has been developed as high priority).
 - The calendar on the IPP which shows all standard setting tentative and confirmed meetings for (2) the next two years. It also shows the various times members are consulted (Member consultation on draft ISPMs and specifications, Substantial concerns commenting period (SCCP), Expert consultations on draft diagnostic protocols (DPs), DP notification periods, etc.)
- Outputs from the standard setting work plan are published on the IPP: adopted ISPMs, approved [3] Specifications and approved Explanatory Documents.
- A general chart of the processes and products that are under the responsibility of the Standard Setting [4] Unit are presented in Appendix 1.
- In order to deliver this work plan, it is essential that adequate skilled staff as indicated in the linked [5] chart are available.
- Abbreviated titles for topics are used for simplicity; full names are available on the LOT. Where possible, numbers and titles of draft ISPMs going through the different steps of the standard setting process are predicted, but these will depend on decisions made by CPM and the SC.In some cased, only approximate numbers are given.
