Performance, Vision, Strategy Tools

In recent years, IICA has designed instruments for evaluating the performance and implementation of development strategies for AHFS systems

Four instruments have so far been developed – veterinary, food safety, plant protection and SPS services. Work is currently in progress on a fifth instrument – an emergency response tool for plant and animal pest and disease outbreaks.

How the PVS Instrument is Applied

Using the SPS PVS as an example: there are 3 fundamental components

- Interaction within the public sector and with the private sector.
- Capacity to access international markets
- Human and financial capital

There are 15 variables under these components

 Each variable has accumulative levels of progress from which to choose the appropriate response.

Internal Communication

Minimum



The public sector does not have mechanisms for dialogue among the various ministries and other entities and between these and the users.



The public sector maintains informal internal communication and with the private sector.



The public sector initiates and promotes internally and with the users concerning existing and proposed regulations.

Optimum



Application of the PVS Tool

The application of the PVS must be accompanied by a broad representative consultation process involving both the private and public sector.

The results of the application of the tool can be shared with various users in the public and private sectors who have a common interest in improving the vision and performance of the institutions.





IICA implemented the STDF funded project to assess the level of implementation of the SPS Agreement in countries in the Americas



The assessment was done using the SPS PVS developed by IICA and applied in 14 countries in the Region

The project was a follow-up to the very successful SPS Initiative and was implemented in two phases

The first phase was the application of the PVS

The second phase consisted of several sensitization seminars for policy makers.

The following are some findings of the application of the SPS PVS in the Region:

Poorly organized or fragmented AHFS systems with little or no legal authority Inadequate communication and information sharing within Ministries and with private sector

Insufficient and inadequately trained personnel

Inadequate and outdated legislation Poor representation at international forums

Inadequate laboratory and diagnostic capabilities

An initiative to facilitate the attendance of countries of the Americas to attend the SPS Committee meetings in Geneva, Switzerland. The Initiative started in October 2002 and continued to October 2008. All 14 countries in IICA's Caribbean region attended and participated in the meetings. Of note, during one of the meetings in 2005 St. Vincent and the Grenadines raised the issue of the of the negative impact of Private Industry Standards on small economies. The subject has since remained on the meeting agenda.
