General Considerations

Reason for the ISPM:


fumigation treatments used in international trade to prevent the introduction and spread of pests of plants

Fumigation treatments adopted under ISPM 28 only state the treatment schedule

There is a need to provide technical guidance including specific guidance on dosage, duration, type of equipment, verification etc. deemed essential for the application of the treatment in accordance with ISPM 28.

General Considerations (cont'd)

Purpose of the draft ISPM





Ensure that treatments are applied *effectively* to minimize economic and environmental impacts

Provide *guidance* on main operational requirements, including verification, for fumigation treatments



Major drafting issues

- 1. Scope of standard: fine balance between guidance and manual.
- 2. "Fumigation entities": added by the SC as a general term used for anyone involved in the physical performance of fumigation (be they a facility or an operator).
- 3. Relevance of the appendices: some believe that the information is readily accessible (in particular appendices 2 and 3) others thought it useful in particular for developing countries.



Major drafting issues

- 4. In some cases required "outcomes" or "examples" rather then "specific requirements" were used to allow flexibility and to allow for the diverse nature of different fumigants.
- 5. Consistency issues with other draft ISPMs on treatment requirements: This is the second (out of 5) treatment requirement standards to go to country consultations. Relevant consultation comments from "Temperature Treatments Requirements (2014-005)" were incorporated.
