nternational Plant Protection Convention

- Coordinating with stake holders
- For stake holders to use online payment systems and many have preference to pay in cash
- System to transmit and receive ephyto securely





- Difficulty to upload export certificate, from customs union to abroad (*this is particular with regards to legislation restrictions in the Russian Federation*)
- Legislation not in place for accepting electronic certification
- Legislation does not allow data entry by industry
- Not enough experts and infrastructure
- Available to implement project
