Background

- A Call for Topics for Standards has traditionally taken place every two years.
- CPM-11 (2016) agreed on issuing a combined call for topics for standards and tools for implementation to create closer collaboration between SC and IC and to streamline the IPPC Secretariat work programme
- The amended criteria of proposed topics and the process of the call were adopted by CPM-13 (2018)
- The 2018 Call for Topics: Standards and Implementation is open from 1 May 2018 to 31 August 2018






Process:

- The Call is made every two years.
- CPs and RPPOs are invited to submit proposals to IPPC Secretariat.
- Proposals are reviewed by Task Force on Topics (TFT), SC and IC
- TFT prepares final recommendation for CPM for adoption

The Process of the Call for Topics: Standards and Implementation¹

(The Call to be issued once in two years)

Submission of topic proposals – WHAT?

Standards:

- new topics for International Standards for Phytosanitary Measures (ISPMs)
- new components to existing ISPMs, such as supplements, annexes or appendices
- revisions or amendments to adopted ISPMs, supplements, annexes, appendices or glossary terms
- pests for which a new diagnostic protocols (DPs) should be developed

Implementation:

- new implementation resources, e.g. guides, workshops, training materials
- revisions to existing implementation resources

Proposals for Phytosanitary Treatments (as annexes to ISPM 28: *Phytosanitary treatments for regulated pests*) are solicited separately in an ongoing <u>call for treatments</u>.





Submission of topic proposals – HOW?

CPs and RPPOs submit proposals

to: IPPC@fao.org

- Through IPPC official contact point
- Completing a submission form preferably in electronic format
 - Addressing the Criteria for justification and prioritization of topics
 - Defining the problem needing resolution in sufficient detail
 - Referencing a gap to be filled in the Framework for Standards and Implementation
- CPs are encouraged to solicit letters of support from other CPs/RPPOs to indicate a broader need for the proposed topic
- Including either of the following:
 - draft specification (for standards, except DPs and terms)
 - draft outline (for implementation resources)
 - DPs are subject to additional criteria (see submission form)

Role of the Task Force on Topics (TFT)

• First meeting (1-3 October 2018, Rome):

- Agree on clear prioritization score scheme
- Screen submitted topics against criteria for justification and prioritization
- Develop recommendations to SC and IC on how to address proposed topic (via standard, implementation material or jointly)
- Use the Framework for Standards and Implementation to identify gaps and propose inclusion of submitted topics

Second meeting (tentatively virtual January 2019):

- Discuss recommendations from the SC and IC Nov 2018 meetings
- Prepare final paper on recommended topics for CPM-14 (2019) for adoption





Role of the SC and IC

- SC and IC can recommend topics in exceptional circumstances for inclusion in the SC/IC work programme outside the Call for Topics
- Selected SC/IC members attend the TFT meetings
- Review all submitted topics and recommendations from the TFT; revise or agree with prioritization and propose a way to address the topic
- Use the Framework for Standards and Implementation to help identify gaps and propose inclusion of submitted topics.






Using the Framework for Standards and Implementation for the Call for Topics

- The Framework covers 8 work areas and is based on the convention text and IPPC Strategic Objectives
- It includes standards and other tools that are:
 - adopted/developed,
 - on the IPPC List of Topics/under development
 - missing/planned to be developed = GAPS.
- The Framework was last endorsed by CPM-13 (2018) and will be reformatted in 2019.

Submissions to the Call for Topics should contribute to addressing the **GAPS** in the Framework for Standards and Implementation
