2019 Work Plan of the IPPC Secretariat Implementation and Facilitation Unit (Updated: 2019-02-06)

Background Information:

The objective of the Implementation and Facilitation Unit (IFU) of the IPPC Secretariat is to facilitate implementation and capacity development (ICD) activities by supporting contracting parties' implementation of the IPPC, ISPMs and CPM Recommendations. In doing so, the phytosanitary capacities of countries, particularly of lesser developed countries, are built.

The work of the IFU is guided by the IPPC Strategic Framework, the National Capacity Development Strategy and the priorities set by the Commission of Phytosanitary Measures (CPM). The IPPC Implementation and Capacity Development Committee (IC) oversees ICD activities.

The IFU will approach activities by:

- Collaborating with CPM subsidiary bodies and other units in the IPPC Secretariat to deliver the IPPC Secretariat's work plan
- Supporting implementation through the development and delivery of global programmes, projects, guides, training materials, workshops and different tools. Regional and national efforts are also supported if they contribute to the development of resources that benefit all CPs
- Evaluating the phytosanitary capacities of contracting parties to help address gaps and increase implementation.
- Building efficient collaboration with relevant global, regional or national stakeholders to optimize the
 use of available resources
- Raising awareness of plant protection in general, with specific emphasis on implementation and capacity development (ICD) activities
- Facilitating the exchange of information among RPPOs and NPPOs
- Monitoring and evaluation the delivery of the IFU work programme

Strategies:

To achieve our Implementation and Capacity Development (ICD) objectives we will:

- 1. Focus on international work that impacts all CPs and on regional or national efforts if these efforts contribute guides or training material for all CPs
- 2. Mobilize resources along with IC members and ensure staff resources match planned work
- 3. Continue building a strong quality-oriented team that supports innovative ideas
- 4. Strengthen cooperation with national, regional and international counterparts to maximize resources to deliver ICD related activities through collaboration with CPs, RPPOs, FAO, different plant health related organizations and institutions and other units of the IPPC Secretariat
