About this survey

Contracting parties to the International Plant Protection Convention (IPPC) have the obligation to establish, update and make available a list of regulated pests as per the provisions set forth in Article VII of the IPPC.

Guidelines on how to establish, update and make available a list of regulated pests were adopted as ISPM 19:2003 (*Guidelines on lists of regulated pests*) at the fifth session of the Interim Commission on Phytosanitary Measures (ICPM-5, 2003). Guidelines on reporting on these pests were agreed as ISPM 17:2002 (*Pest reporting*) at ICPM-4 (2002). This survey addresses implementation of IPPC commitments related to pest listing and reporting and ISPMs 17 and 19.

About the Implementation Review and Support System (IRSS)

Participation in this survey supports the IRSS' work to catalogue the challenges that prevent full implementation of the requirements to establish, update and make available lists of regulated pests and pest reports.
