Framework for Standards and Procedures of the ICPM

Agenda Item 7.5.2 of the Provisional Agenda

- 1. Each year the ICPM approves topics and priorities for standards to be included in the work programme of the IPPC Secretariat. This process is assisted by recommendations from the Informal Working Group on Strategic Planning and Technical Assistance (SPTA) that are considered by the Standards Committee (SC).
- 2. In developing recommendations for ICPM the SPTA and SC use information provided by NPPOs or RPPOs when submitting proposals for new standards, as well as guidance from the report of the fourth session of the ICPM (Appendix XIV of the report of ICPM-4) on criteria to be used when setting topics and priorities for standards. In considering new topics for standards the SPTA and the SC had available the framework document attached as Annex 1.
- 3. This framework document was drawn from an earlier document presented to the Committee of Experts on Phytosanitary Measures (CEPM- the first standards committee that operated before the establishment of the ICPM) in May 1994. The framework was updated and presented to the SPTA and SC to help them consider the topics and priorities for new standards.
- 4. The framework makes clear what has been achieved in the last ten years in terms of standard production, the areas of phytosanitary measures within which these standards are based, and also the areas where there has been little activity.
- 5. The framework is presented to ICPM members for the purpose of facilitating an understanding of which standards have been developed over the past ten years and to be used by ICPM members as a possible tool when considering topics and priorities for new standards.
