# Seventh Session Rome, 4 -8 April 2005 Technical Assistance Work Programme

1. The Secretariat continues to devote much of its time to the provision of technical assistance to developing countries. In order to enhance its capacity to respond effectively and efficiently to the many requests for assistance, the Secretariat has engaged the services of another plant quarantine officer for a period of 18 months to assist in the programme. The IPPC and FAO interventions in phytosanitary are designed to build capacity for implementation of and compliance with the international standards. A summary of Technical Assistance activities for the period 2004-2005 is provided in the Secretariat's report. This report summarises capacity building activities projected for the year 2005-2006. These activities are subject to the availability of funding anticipated from various sources including the Technical Cooperation Programme (TCP), the Prevention of Food Losses fund (PFL/IPPC/858) and Regular Programme and IPPC Trust Fund.
