## **List of Topics for IPPC Standards**

## Agenda item 8.1.5 of the Provisional Agenda

- 1. This paper summarizes the proposed changes to the *List of topics for IPPC standards*. The Commission on Phytosanitary Measures (CPM-6, 2011) requested the Standards Committee (SC) to reprioritize the *List of topics for IPPC standards* to be in-line with the proposed IPPC Strategic Framework, including possible additions, deletions and adjustment of priorities.
- 2. The IPPC Strategic Framework 2011-2019 is under development, but the CPM-6 (2011) agreed to four new strategic objectives. The four strategic objectives are:
  - a) protect sustainable agriculture and enhance global food security through the prevention of pest spread
  - b) protect the environment, forests and biodiversity against plant pests
  - c) facilitate economic and trade development through the promotion of harmonized, scientifically-based phytosanitary measures
  - d) develop phytosanitary capacity for members to accomplish a), b) & c).
- 3. At its May 2011 meeting, the SC reviewed the *List of topics for IPPC standards* based on the IPPC Strategic Objectives. The SC reprioritization was presented to the Bureau in June 2011 and the Informal working group on strategic planning and technical assistance (SPTA) in October 2011. The SPTA found the presentation without the subjects for phytosanitary treatments, diagnostic protocols and glossary terms easier to follow, and suggested that this format is used for the list presented to the CPM. Therefore, subjects are not presented to the CPM but can be found in the Report of the SC November 2011 meeting which is posted on the IPP. Outcomes of the discussions from the SC, Bureau and SPTA meetings are presented below.

### **Reprioritization of Topics**

- 4. In May 2011, the SC applied the following general principles and criteria when considering the prioritization of topics:
  - topics were ranked according to categories of priority 1 to 4 (with 1 being of high priority and 4 being of low priority) and proposed some topics for deletion:
    - Priority 1 a significant amount of resources had already been invested (draft text exists, considering if expert working group (EWG) or technical panel (TP) had met to discuss, had been reviewed by the SC at least once, had been translated); additional reasons do not hinder the development; the topic is both urgent and important or; the topic affects three or more strategic objectives
    - Priority 2 the specification had been approved by the SC or the topic is either urgent or important
    - ▶ Priority 3 a specification had not yet been approved by the SC
    - Priority 4 pending topics; there are no immediate consequences of not having a standard
  - not all pending topics were proposed for deletion; for example, the SC retained two species-specific topics because it was felt a standard was still achievable on these topics
  - a higher priority was given to topics that had recent drafts (although not all were given the highest priority)
  - whether another adopted standard partially covers the concept or the topic could be combined into another topic
  - whether the CPM or the SPTA had recommended the topic as a high priority (although not all were given the highest priority).
- 5. The following reasons were used to consider if a topic should be deleted or not:
  - issues that are national (i.e. issues dealt with by National Plant Protection Organizations (NPPOs) and therefore no need for harmonization)
  - topics considered to be more appropriate for technical manuals or guides with capacity development in mind
  - topics merged into others or already partially covered by other adopted standards.
- 6. In October 2011, the Bureau and SPTA reviewed the list and agreed with the SC recommendations.
- 7. In November 2011, the SC reviewed the list as it normally does on an annual basis and modified it further. There was discussion on possibly deleting the topic on *Electronic certification, information on standard XML schemes and exchange mechanisms (Appendix to ISPM 12: Phytosanitary certificates)* (2006-003). However it was noted that ISPM 12:2011 provides for an appendix on e-certification, and there will be a need to incorporate a reference to the webpage where the XML scheme will be posted. In addition, although the bulk of details of the global standard for electronic phytosanitary certification (ePhyto) would not be part of the appendix to ISPM 12:2011, ISPM 12:2011 gives criteria for e-certification. The appendix should still contain general points on the system, and therefore the topic should not be deleted.
- 8. The List of topics for IPPC standards is presented in Tables 1 and 2:
  - Table 1: List of topics for IPPC standards: includes topics being developed by the Technical panel on pest free areas and systems approaches for Fruit Flies (TPFF), Technical panel on forest quarantine (TPFQ) and Technical panel for the glossary (TPG)

• Table 2: Technical Panels and topics for glossary terms, diagnostic protocols and phytosanitary treatments.

### To note when reviewing the tables

- details of the proposed changes are indicated at the beginning of each Table 1
- rows are numbered for reference purposes only
- the column next to row number indicates hierarchy of terms for standards<sup>1</sup>: T = Topic and TA = Technical Area
- titles given are working titles only and may further evolve during the development of the specification and ISPM
- the highlighted column "Proposed priority" indicates the new priority proposed by the SC, which would replace the existing priority of high and normal.

### **Developments with technical panels**

9. The SC thought it was important that the CPM notes the developments with technical panels. The SC has taken an active supervisory role and has recently included structured sessions on the TP work programmes at the May SC meetings. In addition, the SC has decided that two TPs should work virtually and this demonstrates that the SC has taken into account the reduced funding available for standard setting and also CPM priorities for topics. Nonetheless, the SC also recognizes the importance for experts to meet face-to-face and appreciates that resources have been made available for the TPG, Technical Panel on Diagnostic Protocols (TPDP) and Technical Panel on Phytosanitary Treatments (TPPT) to meet in 2012.

10. The five technical panels have been extremely successful and they have provided significant support to the SC, both by drafting standards and by providing scientific rigor when evaluating data. The SC has recently conducted an in depth review of TP membership and has tried to balance keeping on existing members for continuity with bringing in new members. The SC feels that TPs play a valuable role and recommends that the CPM acknowledge the efforts of the TP experts.

11. It is inevitable that with new groups there has to be a period of adjustment to new ways of working and confidence building. The number of comments on draft technical standards indicates that the SC, TPs and the CPM still have work to do to develop our understanding of the type of information contracting parties need before they can support some of these standards.

### Revision of ISPM 15. 2009 Regulation of wood packaging material in international trade and related phytosanitary treatments

12. The draft Annex 1 to ISPM 15:2009 (2006-011) and the draft annex to ISPM 28. 2007 *Phytosanitary treatments for regulated pests* on dielectric heating as a phytosanitary treatment for wood packaging material (2007-114) were submitted for member consultation on 20 June 2011.

13. The Steward for the Annex 1 to ISPM 15:2009 has reviewed the member comments and many requested that more operational guidance be provided on the use of ISPM 15 approved treatments. The TPPT reviewed the member comments on the phytosanitary treatment and again many stressed the need for operational guidance for the proposed dielectric heat treatment. The International Forestry Quarantine Research Group (IFQRG) reviewed some of the scientific issues supporting this phytosanitary treatment and, as stated in their report, find the proposed treatment schedule for dielectric heating of wood packaging material is supported by sufficient scientific research.

14. The SC, in responding to CPM's repeated requests for the urgent development of alternatives to methyl bromide, discussed how to make progress with this new treatment with a view to presenting it for adoption at CPM-7. The SC realized that there was a particular difficulty with obtaining guidance on use of the treatment at a commercial scale because the treatment has not been adopted and

so can not presently be used for wood packaging material to meet the requirements of ISPM 15:2009. The SC could not resolve this in order to recommend the draft phytosanitary treatment to CPM-7 (2012). The SC seeks guidance from CPM how to make progress with the adoption of this phytosanitary treatment.

15. The SC would like to continue with the development of this treatment in the knowledge that it will only be possible to provide detailed guidance on commercial use after the treatment is adopted and commercial experience gained. If CPM agrees to continue as proposed, CPM could consider requesting contracting parties to monitor and report to the Secretariat on the use of the treatment after adoption. CPM may also wish to review the treatment, within a specified time period, based on these monitoring reports.

The CPM is invited to:

### **Regarding the List of topics**

- 1) *agree to* the proposed priority and Strategic Objective associated with each topic as indicated in Table 1
- 2) *remove* the following ten topics from the List of topics for IPPC standards:
  - Row 3: Minimizing the risk of quarantine pests associated with stored products in international trade (2005-006)
  - ▶ Row 16: International movement of forest tree seeds (2006-032)
  - Row 17: Terminology of the Montreal Protocol in relation to the Glossary of phytosanitary terms (Appendix to ISPM 5) (2009-001)
  - ▶ Row 32: Appropriate level of protection (2005-007)
  - ▶ Row 33: Biological control for forest pests (2009-008)
  - Row 34: Forest pest surveys for determination of pest status (2006-030)
  - Row 35: Guidelines for public officers issuing phytosanitary certificates (Appendix to ISPM 7 2011 Phytosanitary certification system) (2010-038)
  - ▶ Row 36: Framework for national phytosanitary inspection procedures (2005-005)
  - Row 37: Systems for authorizing phytosanitary activities (2008-003)
  - Row 38: Use of permits as import authorization (Annex to ISPM 20:2004 Guidelines for a phytosanitary import regulatory system) (2008-006).
- 3) *consider* whether it is appropriate to develop technical manuals for topics that are suggested for deletion because of possible difficulty in agreeing to a global approach
- 4) *note*, as suggested by the SPTA, that the subjects for phytosanitary treatments, diagnostic protocols and glossary terms, approved by the SC, no longer need to be presented to the CPM
- 5) *note* the List of topics for IPPC standards as presented in Tables 1 and 2.

### **Regarding technical panels**

- 6) *note* that two technical panels will continue to support the SC in providing expertise relevant to their subject areas by working virtually
- 7) *note* the continued importance of holding some face-to-face TP meetings .
- 8) *note* the terms of the majority of TP experts will expire in 2013 and the arrangements the SC has put in place both to ensure continuity and introduce some new blood
- 9) agree that technical panels play a valuable role in standard setting
- 10) thank TP members for their efforts in regards to developing technical standards

### **Regarding ISPM 15**

- 11) *note* ongoing efforts to identify alternative treatments to methyl bromide for inclusion in ISPM 15
- 12) note that dielectric heating schedule is supported by sufficient scientific research
- 13) *note* that there is limited experience with using dielectric heating treatment on wood on a commercial level and sufficient experience to develop detailed operational guidance on use at a commercial scale will only be gained once the treatment is included in ISPM 15
- 14) *agree* to continue with the development of this treatment in the knowledge that detailed operational guidance will only be able to be developed after the treatment is adopted.

#### Table 1: List of topics for IPPC standards including topics under TPFF, TPFQ and TPG

This table presents topics sorted by proposed Strategic Objectives, proposed priority ranging from 1 to 4 (with 1 being the highest priority) and then by the current status. In addition, ten topics are proposed for deletion (listed below with reasons for proposing the deletion). Text in brackets indicates whether the draft was developed by an EWG, TP or a consultant, and the number of meetings where the draft was substantially discussed. Rows marked by \* are proposed for deletion.

### **Explanation for deletion of topics**

## Row 3: Minimizing the risk of quarantine pests associated with stored products in international trade (2005-006)

The SC recommended deletion and proposed this topic as a technical manual under IPPC Capacity Development or as an FAO guide (similar to the forestry guide).

### Row 16: International movement of forest tree seeds (2006-032)

The SC proposed deletion and incorporated this topic into topic: International movement of seed (2009-003) (Row 1).

## Row 17: Terminology of the Montreal Protocol in relation to the Glossary of phytosanitary terms (Appendix to ISPM 5) 2009-001

The topic had a proposed priority of 4, there are only few terms and explanations had proved to be difficult to develop satisfactorily.

#### Row 32: Appropriate level of protection (2005-007)

The SC considered this topic impossible to agree to.

#### Row 33: Biological control for forest pests (2009-008)

The SC was not convinced that harmonized guidance was needed.

#### Row 34: Forest pest surveys for determination of pest status (2006-030)

The SC recommended deletion and proposes it be considered in the Revision of ISPM 6 (Row 24).

## Row 35: Guidelines for public officers issuing phytosanitary certificates (Appendix to ISPM 7:2011 *Phytosanitary certification system*) (2010-038)

The SC considered that, although this topic is relevant for the reliability of phytosanitary certification, it would be difficult to harmonize due to major divergence of views and approaches of NPPOs/contracting parties. The SC recommended deletion of this topic.

### **Row 36: Framework for national phytosanitary inspection procedures (2005-005)**

The SC considered this topic related to national procedures and did not need to be harmonized in an ISPM Proposed for deletion and suggested to develop a technical manual under IPPC Capacity Development.

### Row 37: Systems for authorizing phytosanitary activities (2008-003)

The SC considered that, although this topic is relevant for the reliability of phytosanitary certification, it would be difficult to harmonize due to major divergence of views and approaches of NPPOs/contracting parties. The SC recommended deletion of this topic.

## Row 38: Use of permits as import authorization (Annex to ISPM 20:2004 Guidelines for a phytosanitary import regulatory system) (2008-006)

The SC considered this topic related to national procedures and did not need to be harmonized in an ISPM. The SC recommended deletion of this topic.
